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TIME WAS, not so long ago, when distilling was a dark art. All those mysterious rows of drab, windowless stores (the bonded warehouses), the trademark pagoda roofs, even the manicured lawns, all were out of bounds to the casual visitor.

Then everything changed. Someone realised that the dark art could become a prime tourist attraction and visitor centres, gift shops and restaurants all began to blossom within the confines of these once forbidden areas.

And yet – not all distilleries lend themselves to becoming visitor attractions. In

some cases it is the physical layout that militates against it. In others it is the scale and the precise nature of the activities – so signs like the one above, seen at the Auchroisk distllery, are necessary

It was his early days at the Macallan distillery in Speyside that persuaded circle, after shooting to fame McKidd to make an album Speyside Sessions, with some of his original friends and connections from Elgin.

Most of the songs from banks of the River Spey, included are a number of songs written by Robert Burns.

McKidd, born in Elgin in 1973 and at the age of 17, he went to work at the Macallan distillery. He later went to work with the Lumsden family of coppersmiths, where he was apprentice to the famous Elgin coppersmith Alan Lumsden.
